Stonehenge is the best known prehistoric monument. It stands on the Salisbury Plain. In fact, it is one of the most visited monuments in England and it is a part of the World's Heritage. People used it as a religious place in autumn time and an inner circle shows the position of the rising sun on Midsummer's Day.

The Palace of Westminster is also known as the Houses of Parliament. From the middle of 11th century until 1512, the Palace of Westminster was the royal home to the Kings and Queens.

Big Ben is the bell in the clock tower of the British Parliament. The clock tower is situated on the bank of the River Thames. The whole tower is known as St. Stephen's Tower, with its 13 ton bell.

The first St. Paul's Cathedral was built in 604 AD but burnt down in 675 and the rebuilt cathedral was again burnt down in the Great Fire of London in 1666. The present cathedral was built by Christopher Wren.

Buckingham Palace is a popular landmark. It is the home of the British Royal family since 1837. The palace with 600 rooms is surrounded by a very big garden. Today it is also an office. The Queen's other homes are Windsor Castle and Balmoral in Scotland. A familiar sight at Buckingham Palace is the changing of the Guard ceremony.

Stratford-upon-Avon was Shakespeare's birthplace. He is one of the most famous poets and writers. The 'Swan of Avon' wrote several plays, sonnets and most of his works were played in the famous Globe Theatre in London.
