Natalie:

I am five years older than Shona.
There are twelve fewer pupils in my class than in James's.
My journey is ten minutes longer than Shona's.

Daniel:

I am one year younger than Natalie.
There are six fewer pupils in my class than in Nathan's.
My journey is ten minutes shorter than Raminder's.

Raminder:

I am three years younger than Daniel.
There are four more people in my class than in Daniel's.
My journey is three minutes longer than Nathan's.

James:

I am one year older than Nathan.
There are two fewer people in my class than in Shona's.
My journey is four minutes shorter than Natalie's.
